

## **1. Proposed Ramp Up**

- a. Tier 1 and 2 patients will start receiving studies on May 27
- b. Studies will be scheduled based on tier and initial study schedule date (patients scheduled farther back will have priority)
- c. There will be a phased ramp up based on case transmissions and governor policies
- d. A 9<sup>th</sup> ambulatory bed can be deployed on main campus as an inpatient sleep study in appropriate situations.
- e. Conditions for ramping up and ramping down and operational considerations are included in the table below

## **2. Sleep Lab Patient Flow**

### **a. Prior to visit**

- i. Testing policy, screening requirements, and study process reviewed at time of scheduling and during confirmation calls
- ii. Until COVID-19 community transmission has slowed, patients will be tested at the Sandpoint site or regional clinic sites between 72 and 24 hours prior to their study. A negative test must be documented.

### **b. Patient check in**

- i. Patients will be checked in on the day of study by phone via FSC.
- ii. Patients and caregivers (one per patient) will arrive at the Overlake Medical Center Pavilion and will be screened at the door for symptoms. They will be expected to wear masks throughout; Overlake will provide one if family does not have one.
- iii. Families will navigate to the sleep center and ring the doorbell for tech
- iv. Tech will bring family directly back to sleep room. Masks will be expected of family members. Only one caregiver allowed and this will be enforced.
- v. Arrival times will be staggered to avoid overlapping families to the extent possible
- vi. The waiting room can safely have 2 families while maintaining social distancing from each other and front staff, though goal would be for families to be escorted directly to rooms.
  1. Sign identifies safe seating/asks of families
  2. Colorful feet on floors give seating and waiting locations
  3. 6-foot mark identified from front desk
  4. Extra chairs have been removed from front desk/waiting room area

### **c. Patient set-up**

- i. Patient will be masked until setup starts; caregiver masked until study starts.
- ii. Family rooms will be closed, parents will be expected to remain in the study room for the duration of study.
- iii. Disposable leads – disposable EEG leads, thermal airflow sensors and one-time use belts should be utilized if available
- iv. All reusable leads should be wiped disinfected and wiped with anti-viral anti-bacterial wipes
- v. Techs will have to disinfect electrodes/equipment one at a time; the ending of studies may be staggered to assist with distancing
- vi. No PAP studies will be done in the lab for Phase I.

### **3. Technicians**

- i. Techs will be in gloves, surgical mask, have eye protection, and if needed gowns for contact precautions. Hand hygiene will be done as trained with donning/doffing of any PPE.
- ii. Will practice social distancing in the tech room and will not eat in groups
- iii. Will not share patients in phase 1-3. 1:1 patients
- iv. Will adhere to all Children's screening and health policies surrounding COVID
